



Pupil Survey Comments

Cycle lanes stop at the most dangerous part of the road, e.g. roundabouts.

Concern that 142 and 258 bus routes might be stopped. Should be a crossing outside of school for those walking or cycling. Corner of Coldhabour Lane is dangerous, particularly when it is flooded (frequently). Traffic speed outside of school - could do with a crossing. School bus is expensive. School bus asks for a week's payment, which means if you elect to walk home you do not get a refund or if you remain for an after school activity you will miss that bus but not get a refund.

The public bus service does not cover all areas and so have no choice but to travel by car or dedicated school bus- which is too expensive (and cant use the dedicated service as a one off if we have a detention or if we attended an afterschool club

Have experienced road rage and bad traffic

School buses are very expensive

Walking is fine, School bus is filthy and too small, public buses done run on time.

Some students use different modes of transport, going to school and returning home. Many of them get dropped part way and walk part of the way.



Staff Survey Comments

I drop my children off to their school on my way to work and have too many heavy books to carry to allow me to cycle.

Issues at Sandy Lane with construction and road is not wide enough. Also, fly tipping of huge amount of garden waste regularly affects the roads I use to get to work

Traffic

Traffic lights at the junction of Bushey Mill Lane, Aldenham Road take too long to change when approaching from Bushey Mill Lane which leads traffic to head along Park Avenue leading to further traffic at A41 roundabout. Longer lights change please.

I leave home far too early each day to avoid the build up of traffic.

I travel by car as public transport does not go to the school

I avoid the M25 because otherwise I would be late to school on a daily basis. Sometimes, roads are cut off without prior warning on my route which makes it difficult to get into school. It would take me much longer to get to work and return home if I relied on public transport.

M1 constant congestion - I arrive at work already stressed

Would like to walk but I carry too many bags with marking in, etc, to make this impractical more than once a week.

My route is a common route in to Bushey and Watford, therefore I am usually met with occasional queuing traffic, which can double my journey time in the mornings.

I have no option but to travel by car as no bus route or trains

I have to drop my daughter to a childminder first so am unable to walk

Traffic Light on Bushey Mill Lane are set incorrectly as they allow the other roads excessive time, (30-40 Cars through) and our road (4), this means there are always long queues and some drives go over on Red in their Frustration.

Start early as traffic can be bad

I would love to cycle but the showering/changing facilities for staff are not currently very good. Additional showers with changing space and lockers would be great.

There is always a huge jam from Bushey Academy down to Bushey Arches. This is due to the fact that the double deckers /coaches dropping off the

students of said school park on the main road and nothing can get past them. There is also a huge stream of traffic flowing in the opposite direction down

the hill to the arches. To rub salt in the wound the buses then turn left in about 20 metres and carry on their journey. I have written to the Headteacher of

Bushey Academy and asked him if he could arrange for the students to be dropped off round said corner thus freeing up the main road. This however was

not received with any support. I have made alternative travel arrangements I have to travel further to get to school but my fellow commuters may not be able to do this.

The main problem all morning is the blockage of traffic along North Western Avenue to and around the Dome roundabout. When the lights are not working it's free flowing! Surely something else could be done for the few pedestrians that actually use the crossings???Maybe a bridge? Maybe the supermarkets could pay as they are usually crossing to go there to shop?
